INTRODUCTION

The Active After-school Communities (AASC) program has now been running for over six years. During that time the program has liaised with state and national sporting organisations to help local clubs increase their membership base by exposing primary school aged children to their sport.

Two years ago the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) started to prepare specific National Sporting Organisation (NSO) Reports to detail each sport's involvement in the AASC program. These reports combine a statistical analysis as well as a qualitative review of the information, some examples of best practice case studies and any media articles that may have been generated.

The intent of these reports is for NSOs to utilise the information at a national, state and regional level to help develop their sport. I would also encourage NSOs to use the report as a basis for the sport development officers and the AASC's Regional Coordinators to collaborate and plan deliberate strategies for upcoming terms to promote the transition of children, families and new coaches from the AASC program into respective feeder clubs.

Some transition strategies that have proved successful for many sports are as follows:

- Coordinating a 'Come 'n Try Gala Day' at the end of a term.
- Delivering a clinic at selected sites to promote membership to a designated feeder club or participation in a modified junior sport program.
- Coordinating a cluster of schools/Outside School Hours Care Services (OSHCS) to attend the local club and organise a registration or promotional day.
- Coordinating registration days at participating sites.
- Providing promotional material to sites for coaches to distribute to participating children and their families.

Where sports identify specific development objectives within a particular region/state, the AASC program, through its locally based network of regional coordinators, can provide the opportunity to discuss how the program could assist in meeting these outcomes. Some methods to do this include:

- Actively encouraging schools/OSHCS to deliver that sport in a term that precedes the commencement of the sport season, and therefore feed into registration events
- Actively encouraging participation by schools/OSHCS within identified priority areas for growth or expansion of the sport

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This 2011 Report is again a combination of quantitative and qualitative information related to specific sports. The report looks at where Gymnastics has achieved the greatest success in terms of participation rates and/or growth of AASC program participation.

The following information is included in this report:

- A statistical snapshot of Gymnastics in the AASC program nation-wide, and also by state and region.
- Examples of any targeted partnerships that were developed during 2010.
- A list of organisations and private providers that delivered Gymnastics programs in 2010.
- Any media articles that were generated in relation to the AASC program and Gymnastics.

NATIONAL SNAPSHOT — GYMNASTICS IN THE AASC PROGRAM

Delivery of Gymnastics programs

Each semester, schools and OSHCS identify the sports and activities they would like delivered to the children participating within the AASC program. Activities are generally selected in consultation with the children and or the teachers involved, to identify what would be the most suitable program to engage traditionally inactive children.




Figure 1: Number of Gymnastics programs conducted during 2008–2010




Figure 2: Number of Gymnastics programs conducted in each state or territory in 2010

NATIONAL SNAPSHOT (continued) — GYMNASTICS IN THE AASC PROGRAM

Programs are delivered at AASC sites by community coaches who are registered with the ASC. These may be teachers, OSHCS staff, secondary or tertiary students, local club, personnel, private providers or family members.




Figure 3: Breakdown of types of Community Coaches delivering Gymnastics in 2010

Internal delivery options

In 2010, 20% of community coaches were from schools or OSHCS.

Delivery by sporting representatives

In 2010 representatives of affiliated clubs or associations delivered 28% of all programs. Appendix on page 7 shows a list of the organisations that delivered in 2010.

Delivery by private providers

Where affiliated clubs or associations are unable to assist with meeting the demand for delivery, the Regional Coordinator sources private organisations to help extend the reach of the sport. In 2010 private providers were the second most common group of community coaches delivering Gymnastics sessions in the AASC program. Examples of private providers that delivered Gymnastics within the program in 2010 are provided in Appendix B on page 9.

Schools, OSHCS coordinators and staff regularly vary the types of sports that are offered to AASC participants.




Figure 4 Number of programs by sport in 2010

Figure 4 indicates the sports for which the AASC is providing NSO reports, as well as those sports where the number of programs delivered in 2010 exceeded 200.

AASC GYMNASTICS PARTNERSHIPS

Partnership between the AASC and Mid North & Yorke Peninsula, the Kadina and Districts Youth Centre, South Australia

The Kadina and Districts Youth Centre (KDYC) became involved with the AASC program in 2007 and subsequently have two club members Community Coach Training Program (CCTP) trained. The KDYC has delivered AASC programs to four local schools. The schools have all been able to either walk or use a Special Initiative Grant for bus transport to the local club, because school sites do not currently have suitable facilities for the effective delivery of Gymnastics.

The club used skills and knowledge learnt at CCTP combined with their extensive coaching experience to effectively deliver the AASC program with the key playing for life principals being delivered. Throughout the term the club organised activities to ensure the children remained engaged and challenged. The club handed out flyers to students advertising their regular training night. The club also took part in a gala event organised by the Regional Coordinator.

As a direct result of being involved with and delivering the AASC program at the KDYC, the club has had 10 junior members join. The club has used the AASC sessions as a great taster for participants to gain the necessary skills in order to confidently join the regular training sessions at the club.

Partnership between the AASC and Deniliquin Gymnastics Club, New South Wales

In mid February 2010, discussions surrounding the establishment of a Gymnastics Club commenced between a AASC Regional Coordinator, a gymnastics coach and the manager of the local sports park. Two months later, Deniliquin Gymnastics Club was established and an Enrolment Night was held in April. The number of enrolments well exceeded expectation and consequently the club had to provide three additional classes per week to cater for the 165 enrolments of children aged between 2.5 to 17 years. Four local AASC sites have elected the Deniliquin Gymnastics Club for the delivery of their AASC gymnastics program.

Partnership between the AASC and Port Lincoln Gymnastics Club, South Australia

The South Australian city of Port Lincoln gymnastics club has two coaches who deliver AASC gymnastics sessions to local AASC sites in the region. The club has modern and safe facilities and an excellent junior gymnastics program. This provides a great opportunity for AASC participants to try the sport and, for those children who are keen, pursue gymnastics at club level.

The club has also organised 'come and try' gymnastics sessions with assistance from the AASC program at the Gymnastics Centre, in order to provide more children the opportunity to get active and try the sport of gymnastics.

Up to 50 children have joined the club as a direct result of the club being involved in AASC program. Furthermore, the club has reported that since collaborating with the AASC program many enquiries about the club, and direct requests for membership, have been received.

The Port Lincoln Gymnastics Club commends AASC and hope that the program continues long term. Meryl Davidson Administrative Office and Gymnastics coach at the Port Lincoln Gymnastics Club said the AASC program "will continue to open doors for those children that may not otherwise get the opportunity to experience gym sports or utilise our wonderful facility."

Program boosting kids' health, happiness

Local children are getting active after school thanks to the ongoing Active After-school Communities (AASC) program.

Gymnastics is now booming in Wellington because a number of locals have become community sport coaches, and are now giving local children free opportunities to take part in the sport.

AASC community coaches Rebecca McDermott and Chrystal Bancroft currently deliver gym-nastics to up to 70 children each term.

"It's been great watching these children have a go at gymnastics this term," Mrs Bancroft said. "We teach the fundamentals

and then encourage them to join together to form a local club, like

cheerleading. "We have three groups here at Market Fitness; from kindy to Year 6. we rotate activities and

have heaps of fun while we are at it." The AASC program has been described as a win-win for sport, according to Local AASC regional

coordinator Nina Nyitrai. "Local people are employed as coaches, local sport clubs get free promotion of their sport and we're getting these children more active and healthy," she said.

"There are around 100 children in the Wellington region take part in the program and over a dozen local people being trained as community sport coaches since the initiative began in 2005. "I have seen so many good

things happen since the AASC program was introduced. The region's children have been able to experience loads of sports for free, in a safe and inclusive environment.'

The interest in gymnastics stemmed from Wellington Public

School's circus skills program, which in turn has sparked interest in cheerleading. "It's a significant first step to a

life-long involvement in sport," Ms

Myitrai said. "That's my goal, I want all of our children to play sport for life. The AASC program is a free

Australian Government initiative that is delivered nationally and promotes the transition of primary school children into commu-nity sport. Around 150 000 children take part each term, gaining the opportunity to experience over 70 different sports and up to 20 other structured physical activities.'

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SA 5 Star Community Coach Award Term winner


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Term 3, 2010 winner - Merridy McMahon

Sarah has represented South Australia and Australia in cheerleading and is now sharing her skills, knowledge and passion for the sport with children at the Virginia Primary School as an AASC community coach, representing Gymnastics SA.



Sarah has been working with a group of 30+ children aged between 5 and 13 this term at Virginia Primary School. She started out running the Team Cheer program that has been developed by Gymnastics Australia. Since then she has successfully adapted the activities to further suit the needs of the group. The average attendance at the site is normally around 20 participants, whereas Sarah's program has been attracting well over 30 participants per session.

Sarah sets up the activities, splits the children into two groups and a supervisor looks after the younger group. Her teaching methods are excellent, with fun, inclusive activities that are very engaging.

At the end of each session Sarah brings the two groups back together and the younger children perform a routine that they have been working on for the older children and vice versa.

Sarah presents herself very well. She clearly has a passion for cheerleading and proudly represents Gymnastics SA. She is very reliable and arrives early to set up the equipment in the community hall at Virginia.

The feedback from the Virginia Primary School site coordinator, Cathy Lock, has been excellent.

Leanne is a Level 2 Gymnastics coach and she uses her coaching skills/experience to seamlessly employ Playing for Life principles and resources to create fantastical varied and innovative activities.



Kids come running to Leanne's sessions. They know they'll be doing things that are challenging, new and fun on many levels. There are always surprises and the children love it.

Leanne ensures all age groups are catered for, including around a dozen children with mild disabilities. The kids all love Leanne too, flocking to her like a mother hen. Numerous parents come and watch the sessions, in addition to those who act as helpers. Class numbers are always high with a good gender balance.

The students are always engaged, moving from being participants to helpers to demonstrators and back again. Lessons are meticulously planned with activity stations set up before the session starts. Vertical integration of years R - 7 works beautifully.

Leanne is a teacher and parent herself and sets/maintains the highest levels of safety. These come with thorough explanations of all relevant aspects, perfectly pitched at the appropriate level for students of primary school age.

Leanne lives and breathes activity and healthy living. She shares the fruit platters with the kids and always walks the walk. Regional coordinator Indra Reinpuu said,

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Term 2, 2010 winner – Joseph McConnell

Joseph McConnell from Victoria Loddon 1 region is the 5 Star Community Coach Award winner for Victoria for Term 2, 2010.

Joseph is a Level 2 gymnastics coach who runs a not-for-profit Gymnastics Club in Red Cliffs in a huge shed in a low socio-economic area in addition to his work in the Active After-school Communities (AASC) program.

Kids love Joseph's AASC sessions. All his games and activities are safe and fun and he always provides variety and options to ensure all children can participate at their own level. Joseph makes great use of whatever equipment is available at each school. Where there is little equipment the sessions are modified accordingly, but still with the emphasis on fun.

Joseph has reviewed the Aeroskool and Team Cheer information and incorporates this and the Playing for Life philosophy easily into his coaching. His ability to share information and knowledge with children seems effortless. It inspires children to have a go and to constantly

come back for more. Children love his sessions so much that to date he has had 15 children from the AASC program join the Mildura Gymnastic Club. As the club is a not-for-profit organisation, Joseph tries to ensure the costs are reasonable so families from all areas can afford for their children to participate.

Joseph encourages others in the community to participate in the AASC program. Recently he provided his facilities free of charge to the AASC program to run a gymnastics professional development session for local club and community members and he regularly drove his daughters to sessions before they were able to obtain their driver's licence.

Joseph and his daughters are happy to deliver throughout Sunraysia travelling large distances to support sites (60km round trips are not turned down). So far Joseph has delivered in 14 Sunraysia sites with constant requests for return visits.

AASC and Gymnastics Australia partner to create new resources

A partnership project between the AASC program and Gymnastics Australia has created a wealth of resources to help children to get involved in TEAM Cheer (cheerleading) and AEROSkools (sport aerobics). Two pilots took place in 21 selected AASC sites in Western Australia, New South Wales, Queensland and Victoria during Term 4 of 2009.

In NSW AASC children from Normanhurst OOSH, Cherrybrook OOSH Inc, Samuel Gilbert OOSH, Matthew Pearce BASC and Castle Hill After School Care Inc. took part in the pilot, which culminated in a showcase event at the Castle Hill Community Centre with proud parents and grandparents watching on. The pilot included the provision of six weeks of lesson plans, choreography, warm-up games and stretches.

2. Goulburn NSW

During Term 3, The Crescent School in Goulburn travelled to Canberra to participate in a GymABLE program run by the Canberra City Gymnastics Club.

Qualified instructors helped The Crescent School staff develop their coaching skills and give them ideas on how to run a gymnastics program for special needs students in Goulburn.

GymABLE is a fundamental motor skill development program for children with a physical or intellectual disability. The 4 week program encouraged fitness, fun, coordination and confidence. The program is designed to develop the whole participant, socially, emotionally, cognitively and physically in a safe and friendly environment.

Site coordinator, Lindy Broadhead said that not only did the children improve their physical skills, but their enjoyment of physical activity and self confidence blossomed during the program. The progress made by the children with the most challenging physical and developmental conditions was particularly rewarding. The opportunities these children have to experience safe and stimulating physical activities is very limited. One of the young boys that attended had never been out of Goulburn so loved the bus trip to Canberra each week.

Lindy continued that the children still ask about 'going to gym' and proudly show visitors and parents the photos of their gym experience displayed at the school. It will remain a special memory for them for a long time.

Lindy made special mention of Christine Higgisson, regional coordinator in the Queanbeyan Monaro region and Chris' immense enthusiasm and dedication to providing positive sporting experiences for her students.




Figure 7: Breakdown of types of Community Coaches delivering cheerleading in 2010



Figure 8: Number of Aerobics programs conducted from 2008–2010




Figure 9: Number of Aerobics programs conducted in each state or territory in 2010




Figure 10: Breakdown of types of Community Coaches delivering aerobics in 2010




Figure 11: Number of Trampolining programs conducted from 2008–2010




Figure 12: Number of Trampolining programs conducted in each state or territory in 2010




Figure 13: Breakdown of types of Community Coaches delivering Trampolining in 2010






