The swimming program has been in operation since the AIS opened in January 1981.

During this period it has made a significant contribution to the success, development and progress of swimming in Australia. As well as conducting the residential scholarship program, AIS swimming hosts other selected athletes for training visits, conducts a major coaching conference and meet each year, supplies information to the public and, with the support of our sport scientists and sports medicine experts, collates and disseminates information on all aspects of swimming training for other coaches and students of the sport.

AIS swimming complements and supports the national programs of Australian Swimming Incorporated and assists elite swimmers in conjunction with other programs operating throughout the country.

The objectives of the residential program are:

- To promote swimming excellence;
- To provide opportunities for each elite and potentially elite athlete to follow a sporting and academic or working career.

RECENT OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCES

At the 1992 Olympic Games held in Barcelona, two AIS swimmers won bronze medals.

Nicole Stevenson set Commonwealth records in both the 100m and 200m Backstroke, finishing fourth and third respectively, while Philip Rogers set Australian records in the 100m and 200m Breaststroke finals, winning bronze and finishing sixth, respectively.

Other AIS swimmers who represented Australia in Barcelona were Martin Roberts (Butterfly), current world 100m Breaststroke champion Linley Frame and Individual Medley specialist Matthew Dunn.
