PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2019

I am pleased to present the President's report to you covering the events and activities for the Australian Kendo Renmei Incorporated (AKR) for 2019.

This is the first year that a new executive team has been put in place to coordinate the affairs of the AKR, and although we are effectively two members short (Vivian Yung has stepped in as interim AKR Secretary until a replacement is found), we have found the positions both challenging and exciting. This is not to say that Vivian has not fulfilled her role at her usual peak efficiency, and both David and I would like to thank her for her dedication.

Membership

A separate membership report has been prepared by Vivian Yung, interim AKR Secretary, to be presented to the AKR Annual General Meeting (AGM).

In summary the AKR has had an overall increase of 7.5% (1360 in 2017 to 1462 in 2018). Of note the newest member of the AKR, the Northern Territory Kendo Association (NTKA), has more than doubled its membership (28 in 2017 to 60 in 2018). This year we have added the breakdown adult and junior memberships and it is heartening to see that the number of juniors is also increasing (up by 4.1% from last year). This bodes well for the future of the AKR.

Finances

At the time of writing this report an external audit has been prepared and finalised, a copy of which has been distributed to delegates. This shows a deficit \$35,140 which is a result not only of previously approved spending for the World Kendo Championships in September 2018, but also in the shortfall for the Australian Iaido and Jodo Championships in January 2018.

Although the AKR is still in a strong financial position, this result underpins the need for the AKR Treasurer position to be filled as a matter of urgency so that the AKR's cash flow and trends are monitored by someone dedicated to this task

Elections

In 2018 there were elections held for the AKR Executive Committee, the Iaido Board, the Jodo Board and the Kendo Board.

27th Australian Iaido and 18th Jodo Seminar, Grading and Championships

This event was held in New South Wales at the Valentines Sport Complex, Glenwood from January 20 to January 24.

The visiting delegation from Japan included Mr Mitsuo Shiiya, Jodo Hanshi 8-Dan/Iaido Kyoshi 7-Dan, Mr Yasunori Matsumoto, Iaido Kyoshi 8-Dan/Jodo Kyoshi 7-Dan, Mr Fumio Tsubaki, Jodo Kyoshi 7-Dan/Iaido Kyoshi 7-Dan, Mr Mitsuhiya Higashi, Jodo Kyoshi 7-Dan/Iaido Renshi 6-Dan, and Mr Keiji Igarashi Iaido 5-Dan/Jodo 5-Dan.

This event was attended by 52 members.

43rd Australian Kendo Championships, Seminar and Grading

The event which was held in Sydney at PCYC Auburn on 31st March to 4th April, was attended by 146 competitors during the competition days (Saturday and Sunday), which was then followed by a two-day seminar at the same location attended by 90 participants. It was the first year that a junior competition was introduced, in which 24 competitors participated.

The All Japan Kendo Federation (AJKF) Delegation, Mr Yasuo Suzuki, Kendo Hanshi 8-Dan, and Mr Katsuo Endo, Kendo Hanshi 8-Dan observed the competition and instructed during the two-day seminar held after the days of the competition, with a grading held on the third day for shodan to 5-Dan.

Jodo Seminars

It is heartening to see the Jodo Board taking the initiative to create interest and opportunities not only for participation, but also a forum where practitioners of Jodo can hone their skills and build rapport within this group nationally.

This year saw the first two seminars held in Canberra (15 participants) and Melbourne (20 Participants) of such an event. Each seminar was a two-day event which were led by three of our own 'home-grown' sensei: Dr Ah Loi Lee, Jodo Renshi 7-Dan, Ms Janet Griffiths, Jodo Renshi 6-Dan, and Russell Lawrence, Jodo Renshi 6-Dan.

Relative to the number of registered Jodo exponents these were very well attended, and I look forward to seeing more of these kinds of events not only for Jodo, but also for Iaido and Kendo.

17th World Kendo Championships (WKC)

The WKC is a triennial international event that is held in different host countries. Australia has a proud tradition of being one of the only countries which has competed in this competition since its inception in 1970.

This year was no different. Our dedicated coaching (Kate Sylvester, Coach, and Daniel Jeong, Assistant Coach) and management (Rob Reid, Team Manager, and Yaya Bonggogetsakul, Assistant Manager) teams took our competing teams to Korea after three years of preparation that required dedication and sacrifice from all involved.

I was privileged to have been there to see the fruits of their labours. The results both in the individual's and teams' events were very inspiring.
