OUR VISION

For all Australians to be aware of petanque as a sport enjoyed by players of all levels, from social players to international-level competitors.



OUR MISSION

To support an environment for playing social, competitive and high performance petanque in a spirit of friendship, unity and fair play.

SNAPSHOT

There is great diversity between States and Clubs in terms of age, gender, social players vs comp players and where people play.

This plan aims to address the needs of all players.

- Victoria has 49% of all licenced players
- Overall, 46% players are women, but clubs range from 6 100% women players
- Average age 70, but some Clubs have over 80% of members 65+ and some have just 20%
- Nationally 45% of licenced players play in a competition requiring a licence but in NSW it is 60% and in Tasmania and Queensland it's about 10%
- Some Clubs require all players to hold a licence (all Clubs in WA and NSW) and some Clubs have social players who do not hold a licence
- Half of all Clubs have some sort of Clubhouse; some have storage facilities and 35% have neither.

This **Petanque – A Sport for All** Strategic Plan sets out a path for petanque to achieve its vision, mission and goals.

Our motto for the next five years is:

CONNECT – ENGAGE – INSPIRE

This motto applies to our current competition and social players, as well as potential players – everyone in the Australian community who will learn about petanque and join us to play this sport in the years to come.

The Board of Petanque Federation of Australia encourages all players to collaborate on this exciting journey of renewal and revitalisation for the benefit of all.


The goals we have set for the next 5 years are exciting, ambitious and achievable with the support of our members.
