The Men's team began its quest for Edinburgh Gold by having a tally of 36 Individual International Medals during the year (10 Gold - 16 Silver and 10 Bronze). The meets undertaken to achieve these were the Canada Cup, Meet of Champions Mission Viejo, Santa Clara Invitational, Pan Pacific Games, Universiade Games, Junior Olympics and the AIS International Meet.

Win Killarney Short Course	One of the most outstanding events was the 400 IM when the Institute men took out the first 6 placings and all recorded times better than the NSW record. The Men's Team came away from the meet with 9 Gold, 8 Silver and 6 Bronze Medals.
Metropolitan/State Winter	Although most competed admirably at these meets, Rob Woodhouse had one of the most outstanding swims when he recorded a personal best for the 400 IM - 4.21.68.
24 July Short Course Record Attempt	Matthew Renshaw, Gary Lord, Paul Rowe and Peter Dale combined as a team for the 4 x 100 FR/S Relay and broke the National and Australian Record with a time of 3.24.38.
Pan Pacific Games (Tokyo)	Rob Woodhouse 2nd 200 IM 2.05.62 Matthew Renshaw 3rd 100 FR/S 51.17
Universiade Games (Kobe)	Rob Woodhouse 2nd 400 IM 4.20.76 Peter Dale swam the fastest ever time for an Australian in the heats of the 200 FR/S and broke the National Record.
Junior Olympics (Osaka)	Craig Boettcher 1st 200 IM 2.10.81 1st 400 IM 4.39.56 2nd 200 BK 2.12.12
Short Course Winter Nationals	The men's team won 1 Gold (Jens-Peter Berndt - 200 IM - 2.03.48), 3 Silver and 6 Bronze Individual medals.
AIS International Meet	The men recorded 4 Gold, 8 Silver and 6 Bronze. The golds went to R Woodhouse 400 IM and 400 FR/S, P Lee 200 BR/S and J P Berndt 200 IM.

AIS Swimming History

The Australian Institute of Sport since its inception in 1981 has had a hand in the fortunes of Australian Swimming. Since 1981 the AIS has attained 144 International Gold Medals, 84 World Rankings and 110 'National Level' records. These results count for winter performances up to December 1985 and show the significant contributions made to the development and progress of Australian Swimming.

The swim program, coaches and facilities are continually being assessed and improved to a level at which it is becoming increasingly difficult to find areas which require attention. One example of improvements is the new accommodation block which is situated on site and was opened to athletes in late 1985. This new facility was designed to assist elite athletes in their quest for excellence.

In 1982 at the Brisbane Commonwealth Games, 18 AIS swimmers competed and accounted for 16 individual medals. Georgina Parkes came away from the 1982 World Championship in Equador with Australia's only medal, the silver for 200m Backstroke.

In 1984, 14 Institute swimmers (7 male and 7 female) represented Australia at the Los Angeles Olympic Games. Sue Landells, Karen Phillips and Mark Stockwell claimed silver medals while Michele Pearson and Rob Woodhouse each claimed bronze medals.

The AIS swimming program has a commitment to the sport much broader than merely coaching elite swimmers. The AIS Swim Program also incorporates a Satellite Coaching Program, Swimming Promotions, close co-operation with Sports Science projects, national training schemes, development camps and support for study or work programs.

This year's team is in the quest for Edinburgh Gold, with future sights on excellence at Seoul. The tradition of excellence in Institute swimming is firmly rooted in the short but outstanding history of the program. Winning and Institute swimming have become almost synonymous - a dedication to excellence and discipline which makes the AIS a household name in the swimming world.
