Objectives of OASIS

- efficient and cost effective access to a range of sport information resources to ensure that Australia stays at forefront of international sport and sport development
- Improve resource sharing, management of resources and the purchasing power of consortia members
- Develop products and services to improve access to sport information on Australia



Need for OASIS

- Increase in electronic sport content – databases and journals and the subsequent increased costs in acquiring access to this information by the Australian sport sector.
- Licence/copyright restrictions imposed by publishers or legislation (Digital Copyright Amendment Act 2000)
- Demand by clients for 24/7 access and anywhere in the world

Management Issues - Funding

How has it been funded to date?

- Existing NSIC funding for fulltext databases
- Financial support from the Australian Institute of Sport
- Savings through efficiencies in NSIC operations



Management Issues - Funding

How can OASIS continue to pay increasing costs of electronic information?

- Be stronger in negotiations with publishers and vendors?
- Reduce number of databases?
- Reduce number of simultaneous users?
- Obtain more efficiencies if possible in NSIC operations particularly in document supply and journal management that can release resources for electronic resources?
- Obtain funding from SIS/SAS and their information centre's?
- Obtain additional funding from ASC/AIS?

 - NSIC Staff access to all areas including NSIC staff working tools – procedures and policies

 - ASC /AIS Staff access to all areas except NSIC staff working tools.
 - SIS/SAS and NSO's access to ASC or networked licence resources such as EBSCO Databases.




Management Issues - Promotion
